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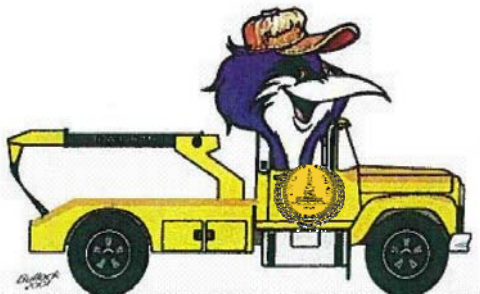
Vehicles left abandoned on City streets cause a variety of problems, such as...

# Remove Abandoned Vehicles Now

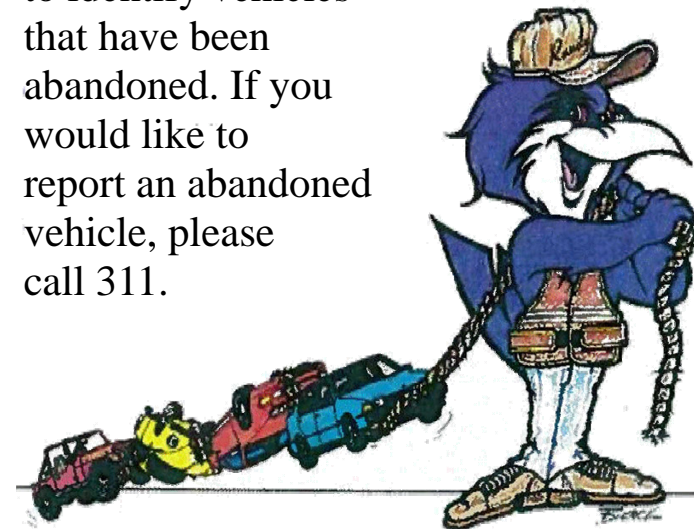
The City of Baltimore through its Department of Transportation, in partnership with Housing and Community Development, has launched its new RAVN campaign. The RAVN campaign targets the swift removal of abandoned vehicles throughout Baltimore City.

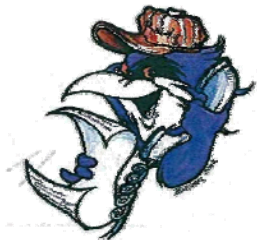
# RAVN

The campaign consists of two phases:

- Abandoned Vehicle
- Removal of Abandoned Vehicles

The City of Baltimore needs your assistance to identify vehicles that have been abandoned. If you would like to report an abandoned vehicle, please call 311.





## What is an abandoned vehicle?

An abandoned vehicle could be described as a derelict vehicle. A derelict vehicle is a vehicle that is damaged or deteriorated making it inappropriate for driving.

An unlicensed vehicle, on public or private property, meaning that the vehicle does not have a license plate, not registered at the Motor Vehicle Administration or has expired registration.

A vehicle that has been parked in the same location on the street for more than 48 hours could be targeted as an abandoned vehicle.

### Abandoned Vehicle

#### Cleaner and Greener Initiative Every Monday

The City is offering a period of time for vehicle owners who wish to have an abandoned vehicle removed. This program is designed to expedite the removal and disposal of abandoned vehicles.

During this period, vehicle owners can contact the City of Baltimore to have abandoned vehicles removed from right-of ways or accessible properties without fines or penalties assessed.

Here's what the vehicle owner needs to do in order to take advantage of this program...

- Call Baltimore City's information number at 311 to schedule an appointment.
- Give the specific location, make and model of the vehicle.
- Have the free and clear vehicle title and personal identification available to present to the tow driver for immediate removal.

## Removal of Abandoned Vehicles (Standard Procedures)



If the vehicle is on a city street, it is . . .

- Marked by a Parking Control Agent for identification.
- After 48 hours, it is re-inspected, ticketed and towed.
- This process can take up to 5 days.

If the vehicle is on private property . . .



- The owner of the property is notified of the violation by both certified and regular mail.
- Owner is given a 10-day period to abate the violation.
- At the completion of the 10-day period, an inspection of the property is conducted. If the vehicle is still visible, it is then reported to be ticketed and towed.
- This process may take up to 17 days.

**Normal towing and storage fees start at \$220.00 plus a \$15.00 per day storage fee. This is in addition to any citations issued.**
