



OPERATION CRIME WATCH

1. Identify a resident of your block who will serve a contact person to Operation Crime Watch Liaisons and to your respective police district.
2. All residents on the block should apply for crime watch numbers. The application can be filled out online at:

Email your name, address, phone number, police district, and neighborhood association affiliation (not required) to operationcrimewatch@baltimorecity.gov

OR

Call (443) 984-2371 / 2372 with the above information. If you leave a message please spell your first and last name as well as your street name.

3. Submit application to Operation Crime Watch
4. The number of Crime Watch Numbers on your block will be verified by the Baltimore Police Department.
5. Schedule a meeting with the block representative and an OCW Liaison to determine sign placement.
6. The Mayor's Office on Criminal Justice will inform the block representative when the signs will be erected by the Department of Transportation.

**Please note: This process is subject to change and can be adapted to fit the particular needs of a given block.

Blocks requesting Crime Watcher signs will be granted 2 signs (unless the layout of the block requires an alternate arrangement).

At this time, if residents desire signs that identify their community/neighborhood organization, the residents will be responsible for paying for the signs. Ordering information will be supplied upon request – signs cost \$45.00.

Otherwise the signs are generic and will read:
